

# January Family Project

Every day in kindergarten we track how many days we have been in school! Keeping track of how many days in school helps us to learn about tally marks, counting by 1's, 2's, 5's, and 10's, it helps us to know odd from even, it helps us to understand place value and much, much more! Students could write their names on the shirt with puffy paint/paint pens and then draw or attach 100 of something to the shirt. For instance you might use 100 small iron on numbers, 100 iron on gemstones, you could glue on or sew on 100 gummy bears, 100 suckers, 100 legos, 100 lifesavers! Anything you can think of is fine; just try to get them attached as best you can!
